Burnt Thicket Theatre is an independent company producing live theatre that brings awareness to real issues in our community, planting seeds for positive social change.

We create theatre productions that offer audiences a visceral immersion in another human being's lived experience, believing that "walking in someone else's shoes" is part of theatre's power. We believe in empowering artists to make work that matters, and the majority of our productions are the fruit of new script development processes.

Created in 2007 in Calgary, Burnt Thicket Theatre moved to Saskatoon in 2017. To date we have generated 8 professional touring productions that performed in 27 cities across Canada. In 2012 we toured She Has a Name for 5 months, impacting audiences from Halifax to Victoria with the struggle against human trafficking. Our most recent live world premiere, My Little Plastic Jesus, provoked dialogue about religion, politics and identity in living rooms across the prairies. Our production of Every Brilliant Thing inspired honest conversation about suicide and emotional wellness, most recently among nearly two thousand patrons at Rosebud Theatre last summer. In 2021-2022 we produced two fiction podcast series of world premiere plays for the ear. The latest is We Treaty People, in which 49 Indigenous and non-Indigenous artists collaborated on 19 episodes about truth and reconciliation.

We believe sharing stories that kindle hopeful change in people's lives matters, and it only happens through the collaborative faith and effort of a host of artists, donors and supporters, far beyond the artists and our staff listed here.



## Playwright's Notes

I started writing this play almost 15 years ago. It took several attempts to sort who it was about, and many years of waiting to see where they were going. Time afforded me two distinct vantage points, and along the way there have been adjustments, surprises, magic, and maturity. I've literally seen life from both sides of the counter.

Since the beginning, Evergreen had a strong sense of place. I've felt a kinship with this diner, and knew it to be an incubator for something significant. It wasn't always called The Evergreen, but it's true to its roots. This compilation of places and times is by no means biographical, but inspired by people I've known who've wrestled with what it means to truly love.

Thomas Merton writes about the wilderness as a place we go to meet with God. It isn't always a barren or desolate wasteland. For me, it brings to mind that scene in The NeverEnding story where Atreyu stands before a mirror and has to face himself. A wilderness can be lonely, but it can also be liberating. I think it reveals where we're wounded. On the other side I'm learning to be kinder with my complexities. To be both rooted and reaching. Even in the midst of the inexplicable.

So we wait, and we wonder. And in the weight, there is wonder.

Thank you for being a part of something I waited for.

### **Director's Notes**

It's a gift to bring Krista Marushy's new play to the stage, and to you, our audiences. Krista has been an artistic collaborator for twenty years, since our days on staff together at Vancouver's Pacific Theatre, then cheering on James Popoff and me as we organized Burnt Thicket in 2007-2008 and began touring original work. Krista supported the company's move to Saskatoon in 2017, sharing many phone conversations about new plays and life as parents of young children. Krista introduced us to Every Brilliant Thing, hosted a performance of Tim Bratton's My Little Plastic Jesus in her Calgary home, and wrote Middle Ground for our first series of audio plays, Tied In Knots.

Krista shared her play *Evergreen* with me in 2018 and it went on my wish list, just before winning the Scripts On Fire competition with Fire Exit Theatre. Tim and I returned to it a year ago and realized this play speaks even more profoundly on this side of the pandemic.

Know anyone who has experienced some of these realities over the last three years: disappointment, abrupt life changes, isolation, vocational uncertainty, or feeling deeply misunderstood? How about anxiety, loneliness, or grief?

Now before you question your decision to come to the theatre today, think of this moment as if you're clinking up the first hill on a spectacular rollercoaster. I think you'll want to hear the questions the characters of *Evergreen* ask each other. Philosopher George Steiner said that works of art interrogate us, ask us, "What do you feel, what do you think of the possibilities of life, of the alternative shapes of being which are implicit in your experience of me, in our encounter?" (from Steiner's book *Real Presences*) Art can even say to us, "Change your life." May you risk hoping for something better than your fears, and take a step away from isolation toward being known. Now please keep your arms and legs inside your seat at all times – enjoy the ride!


